Assortment of pencils

HB is the middle the higher the number the softer or harder the pencil, H denoting hard and B denoting soft. A nice range would be 6B, 4B, 2B, HB, 2H, 4H, 6H. But this range is up to you.

Pencil sharpener

Charcoal

Again, please get what you like. Vine charcoal is much softer, easy to smudge and wipes away easily, but does NOT give you a rich black. Compressed charcoal sticks to the paper more and is harder to completely erase. Both charcoals come in a variety of hardness. You don't need to get a variety unless you want to.

Eraser, Staedtler erasers are my favorite

Kneaded eraser (this is a GRAY eraser sometimes called a gum eraser, please note that there is a yellow cubed eraser called gum that does not work in the same way)

India ink also known as sumi ink, higgins works well

Brush for ink. This brush must be round. You may want to start with a medium to smaller size.

Paper, 18x24 pads are nice. These drawing papers slightly vary in weight. One kind in particular is quite thin and cheap looking, so pick a sturdier paper. If there is another kind of paper you prefer to work on, you should bring in whatever you prefer.
