## **Supply List**

Note: All supplies are suggestions. Mention of a brand or retailer should not be considered SOA endorsements. Students may make substitutions.

- Chairs for caning – Three options
  - Bring your own chair  
Note from the instructor: The chair you select should be in good condition. It should be tight and clean. Chair may need to be disassembled and glued. Have repairs done before you attempt to cane the seat.
  - Buy a chair from the instructor. Ready-to-cane chairs can be purchased for \$20. Choices are limited.
  - Practice on chairs provided. Chairs remain the property of the instructor. (Material fees still apply)
- Kitchen pail
- Kitchen sponge
- Small spray bottle
- Large towel to protect work surface (not new)
- Hand towel (not new)
- Flat edge tweezers or jeweler's pliers
- Small rattail file---to clean out holes (if you don't have one, don't buy one)
- Standard awl (may be purchased from instructor)
